Summer Jobs

Each summer there are a limited number of opportunities for summer jobs with the Federal Government. These jobs vary from office jobs to Park Rangers and are located throughout the United States.

Some of these jobs require that a student take the Summer Employment Examination which will provide an opportunity for him to compete on a merit basis for a summer job. The Examination will be administered once each month from January to March 1972. The last possible application date for competing in the written test is February 2.

There are also special classifications of jobs open to a student who has an outstanding scholastic record, a certain area

of study which is needed for a special job, or a skill such as typing.
