



# Cub Wrestlers Crushed; Bounce Back Hoped on Fri.

The wrestlers of Behrend Campus suffered their worst loss of the season at the hands of a powerful Cuyahoga West 45-3. The defeat dropped the grapplers record to 2-5-1 on the year.

Julio DiMarco (7-1) lost his first duel match of the year to Ben Camargo 4-1. Julie couldn't control his man and suffered a takedown that cost him the match.

At 126 lb., Mike Kerr battled John Coleman even until the 2nd period when Kerr sustained a knee injury. Unable to move, Kerr survived a 7-2 defeat. Kerr is a doubtful starter for Friday's match against DuBois.

Bob Newcombe had a few good take down attempts but couldn't keep up the pace as Cuyahoga's Herrera pinned him in the 3rd period.

In the 142 lb. match, Larry Fabrizi, coming back from the flu, wrestled sluggishly which eventually cost him the match 6-1.

John Hotchkiss (150 lb) and Tom Tylman's inexperience became apparent again as they fell to 2nd and 3rd period pins respectively.

The highlight of Behrend's frustrating evening came from Paul Jazenski. Paul defeated Bruce Bora 8-4 with a fantastic comeback with 40 seconds remaining in the final period. Down 4-2, Paul reversed his opponent and put him on his back until the final buzzer. Jazenski remains undefeated in duel matches with a 7-0 slate.

The other half of the Wild Pollacks, Tom Staszewski, did

not fare so well. He was pinned by Cuyahoga's Wild Pollack Ted Skwarski in the 3rd period. Stasz wrestled extremely aggressively but could not keep pace with his Polish adversary.

Mike Deeb was forced to forfeit because of a painful injury received in practice. Smiley, absent one tooth, should be back for Friday's match.

The team is physically hurting, but Coach Ed Onorato expects a good turnout Friday to psyche his boys up.

"The boys are down, there's no question about that. But I feel with a good turnout, we can defeat DuBois on Friday, and give the fans something to cheer about."
