On Friday the Cubs were hosted by the DuBois campus and came away with a 78-60 win. Behrend was sluggish at the start as DuBois' aggressive man-for-man defense seemed to bother the Cubs. However, Behrend soon got untracked and owned a 40-33 halftime edge. The second half was more of the same as Behrend coasted home with a 78-60 victory. Coach Sweeting praised DuBois for their agressiveness and hustle but Behrend's zone press that they employed the entire game was too much for the losers to handle. Glenn McKinney drilled the nets for 23 followed by Ike Burnett's 15 to lead Behrend scoring. Nardozza, Majeski, and Schutz had 39 points combined to lead the losers.

On Saturday the Cubs journeyed to Uniontown to face Fayette Campus who are the defending commonwealth campus champions. The first half was close as the two powers traded buckets at an even pace with Fayette leading 52-51 at the half.
