Also sponsored by the Board last week was a concert by the nationally-known group, the Guess Who. The Canadian-based musicians performed before a sell-out crowd at the Warner Theatre.

The main feature upcoming on

the SUB's schedule is the appearance of Robin Williams on October 12, 13, and 14 at 9 p.m. There is more to Williams than a guitar and a good voice. Audiences get caught up with his easy going, no frills, no fancies, charm. There is a touch of that rare commodity, modesty, still apparent in his stage presence.

Robin says he sings whatever he likes. "I have no particular theme or message to get across," he says. "I just like to entertain." He has a wide repertoire, from

folk, to country, to pop. This musical range has enabled him to become a campus favorite on the touring circuit in a variety of places such as New York, Kansas, Montana, and North Carolina.

Raised in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, Robin is a graduate of Presbyterian College in South Carolina where he majored in history. Currently he is the only act touring the circuit who came from one of the member colleges of the program.
