Seeing Through Shuck edited by Richard Kostelanetz. 343 pages. Ballantine \$1.65.

Seeing Through Shuck is an anthology of the works of some of America's finest young reporters. Kostelanetz, a veteran of three other edited anthologies, has collected essays from such prominent young writers as Abbie Hoffman, Ron Rosenbaum, David Durk Julio Burmedd Johnson Durk, Julie Buamgold, Ishmael Reed, Michael Glenn and Paul Theroux. It's muckracking revisited as these 25 young writers attack everything from the Playboy mystique to police corruption and food-pollution.

If you're into critical essays, Seeing Through Shuck is the most modern and up-to-date book of it s type. Kostelanetz calls the writing in this anthology "...direct, tough-minded, and avowedly challenging...", and that's exactly what it is.
