# PHEAA Deadlines Approach

Rep. David Hayes announced today that he has received a supply of applications for Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency grants for both veterans and regular 1974-75 higher education students needing financial aid for the 1974-75 academic year and who are not 1973-74 state grant recipients.

He explained that the regular applications may be used by either a 1974 high school graduate or a student who graduated from

high school prior to 1974 and is not a 1973-74 state grant recipient

"Veterans applications should be used only by veterans of the U. S. Armed Services who are not 1973-74 state grant recipients" he added.

Applications from veterans are accepted at any time up until April 1 of the academic year for which aid is requested and processed for all or a portion of the academic year, depending on the date received and availability of funds.

The filing deadlines for 1974-75 non-veteran applications are as follows: April 30-All current year (1973-74) grant recipients who are applying for renewal of their award; May 31-Pre-1974 high school graduates, not current year recipients, who plan to enroll in a degree program; Aug. 1-All Non-degree programs including secondary school seniors, enrolling in business, trade, technical, hospital school of nursing or two year terminal community college programs.
