# Students Take Note

Many students seem to be confused about the purpose of validation and the relationship of pre-registration to registration under the pre-registration system adopted last term. It is hoped that the information given will clarify those points.

Every student must go through registration which is held one or two days before classes start each term. Preregistering does not excuse you from registration even if you validate your schedule. However, preregistration does offer advantages:

If you preregister and validate your schedule, you do not need to come back a day ahead of registration for advising. You need only come back for registration itself.

If you validate your schedule at preregistration, you will go through an abbreviated process at registration.

Students who do not preregister, or who preregister but do not validate a schedule, will have to see their advisors the day before registration and go through the longer registration process.

It is the student's responsibility to know the date of registration and to be on hand at the assigned time. Early in August instructions will be mailed for registration to all students at their home address. If these instructions are not received within a reasonable period of time before classes start, we suggest telephoning the Academic Affairs Office for the information. Students who do not appear for registration at the stated time will be charged a late registration fee of \$10.

# Preregistration Schedule

## PREREGISTRATION FOR SUMMER TERM AT BEHREND

Students planning to attend daytime courses at Behrend during the summer should see their advisor during the two-week preregistration period, May 6-17.

All that is required is a No. 2 card, completed and signed by the advisor, which is to be brought by the student to Summer registration. Registration for Summer courses will be Wednesday, June 5, from 6-9 p.m. in the Reed Union Building (2nd floor).

## PREREGISTRATION FOR FALL TERM AT BEHREND

We ask that all students give particular attention to the explanation of preregistration which is given in the chart below.

Advising will begin Monday,

May 6. All students returning to Behrend in the Fall should meet with their advisor according to the schedule below.

The materials prepared with the advisor should be brought to the Preregistration Station (old maintenance building) on the assigned date (see chart) and turned in for processing. On the validation dates given, the student may pick up a copy of his schedule and indicate acceptance of the schedule by signing for it. This "validates" the schedule; if the student does not sign, the course cards being held for him will be returned for reassignment to someone else.

The Preregistration Station will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. Late preregistration will be accepted

at the Station and processed as received.

All students, whether or not they have preregistered or validated a schedule, must attend registration before going to classes Fall Term.

## PREREGISTRATION FOR FALL TERM AT UNIVERSITY PARK

Students who have been approved for change of assignment to University Park for Fall Term should obtain a preregistration form from the Academic Affairs Office (Administration Building) and complete it with their advisor during the two-week preregistration period, May 6-17. The form should be turned in to the Academic Affairs Office by Friday, May 17, at 5 p.m.

# Write Song and Win Cash Galore

The songwriter has been called the poet and philosopher of his time. He may be the historian as well. Songwriting is a fun and healthy way to express emotions—love, protest, friendship. Songwriting is story-telling and poetry. Today there is no more effective way to reach, influence and affect people than through music.

The American Song Festival is the first international competition for songwriting ever to be held in the United States and the first in the world ever to be open to amateurs as well as professionals. The Festival is designed to encourage and salute those who believe they can write a song and are willing to try.

There are two divisions of competition—amateur and professional—and six categories of music. There is also a special non-competitive category for novelty music such as marches, children's songs, etc. An entrant may submit his song for judging in any category he feels his song best fits.

The 36 finalists will hear their songs presented live in concert at the Saratoga Performing Arts Center in Saratoga Springs, New York, over the Labor Day weekend, 1974. Each of the 36 finalists will receive \$500 plus an expense paid trip to Saratoga. The winners of each category will receive an additional \$5,000. The winners of each division will receive an additional \$25,000. The overall grand prize winner will additionally receive a beautiful concert grand piano. There is \$128,000 in prize money plus valuable merchandise for the winners.

Leaders from every phase of the music industry will participate in the initial screening process so that every song will be heard by a professional in the music industry. The Advisory Board includes leading executives of ASCAP, BMI, leading publishing and recording companies and composers guilds. The final judging will be by eminent personalities from all fields of music.

The entry fee in the competition and the Festival is \$10 plus 85c for handling. For this entry fee, the entrant receives the official kit which includes a black cassette upon which he will record his song; the official songwriters handbook which describes the laws of copyright, publishing, details related to mechanical rights, performance

societies, how to market songs, etc., and the entry blank.

The entrant doesn't need to know how to read music. He may record it himself or have friends record it. The quality of the production will not be a factor in the judging. Judging will be based upon originality, lyrical content and musical composition.

The American Song Festival has been applauded by music

industry leaders because it provides for the first time an orderly and legitimate way for amateur songwriters to bring their music to the attention of the music industry. We would like to encourage your support of the American Song Festival.

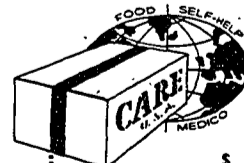
