## **Finals Schedule**

Classes for the Fall Term 1974 will officially end Saturday, November. Final examinations will be held on Monday and Tuesday, November 18, 19, as scheduled below.

Students are reminded that the final examination is an integral part of the course, and failure to attend could result in the student's failing the entire course, regardless of the quality of the course work submitted before that date. In accordance with section 0-4 of the Senate Regulations, a student who is absent from a final examination for a cogent reason may have his grade deferred upon the authorization of the Dean of Faculty.

The Senate Regulations also provide in Rule 0-8 that any student with two or more final examinations at the same time should file a request for a conflict at the time and place specified in advance by the instructor for the course. Any student with three or more examinations on the same day may file a similar request, and conflict examinations will be arranged, if feasible.
