Coach Amy Atkinson is very proud of 'ne women's stamina and desire to win. "We had only two actual weeks of practice before our first three games. Those players had conditioning, offensive strategies, defensive drills, and everything imaginable jammed down their throats so fast that it was amazing that they all hung in there."
