Lady Cubs Win 3 of 4

Behrend's Women's Basketball team now stands 6 and 9 have come out victorious in three of their past four games.

Back on Saturday, February 2, the Cubs wiped out Geneva College, 73-36, raising their Keystone Conference Record to 4 and 7. Geneva, who outthit Behrend 45-18 in the first half, and 28-18 in the second, fell to its sixth straight loss in the season. They haven't won a game in conference competition yet. Twelve Cubs in all tallied in this

game. Our high scorer was Natalie Kuhn who dunked 13 points. Following her were Molly Heidecker and Lois McKean, each adding 10 points. Our key rebounder was Patty Hillkirk, who retrieved 9 times. High scorers for Geneva were Jan Robie and Jan Banks, each contributing 10 points.

Next to fall to the Cubs were the Villa Maria Victors. In their February 5th get-together, Behrend downed VMC 72-52. This game brought our record up to 5

and 8 and dropped our opponents to a low 1 and 4 on the season scoreboard. Leading the Cubs in scoring was Sharon Winston pumping in 16 markers. Cheryl Ramsdell came in right behind Sharon with 14. Scoring for the Victors were Kim Kelly, Laura Abbott, and Andrea Glucki, pouring in 17, 15, and 11 points respectively. BC outshot their opponents from the field 35-17.

The Lady Cubs slipped up on the 7th as they let Mercyhurst College come out the victors in what was MC's first Keystone Conference game. The Lakers over-road the Cubs 59-48 at the Mercyhurst Campus Center. This was the loss that dropped our girls' record to 6 and 8 while bringing Mercyhurst up to an even 4 and 4 record for the season. Tallying for our team

were Sharon Winston and Cheryl Ramsdell with 20 points apiece. On Mercyhurst's end of the court, Robin Walker sunk 22 points worth, Tricia Mahone, 19, and Debbie Chilcott, 10. MC outshot Behrend in field goals 27 to 19.

Our third win came this past Saturday afternoon as Behrend rolled over Allegheny College with a score of 53-49. Molly Heidecker led the Cubs with 15 points, the same 15 points that brought Behrend up to a victory after a 29-23 deficit at halftime. Assisting Molly on Behrend's comeback was Cheryl Ramsdell and the game's leading rebounder, Natalie Kuhn. Creating Allegheny's number were Kathy Kampert with 17 points, and Lisa Myers with 10. Behrend's Conference slate rose to 2 and 1, and their overall record to 6 and 9.

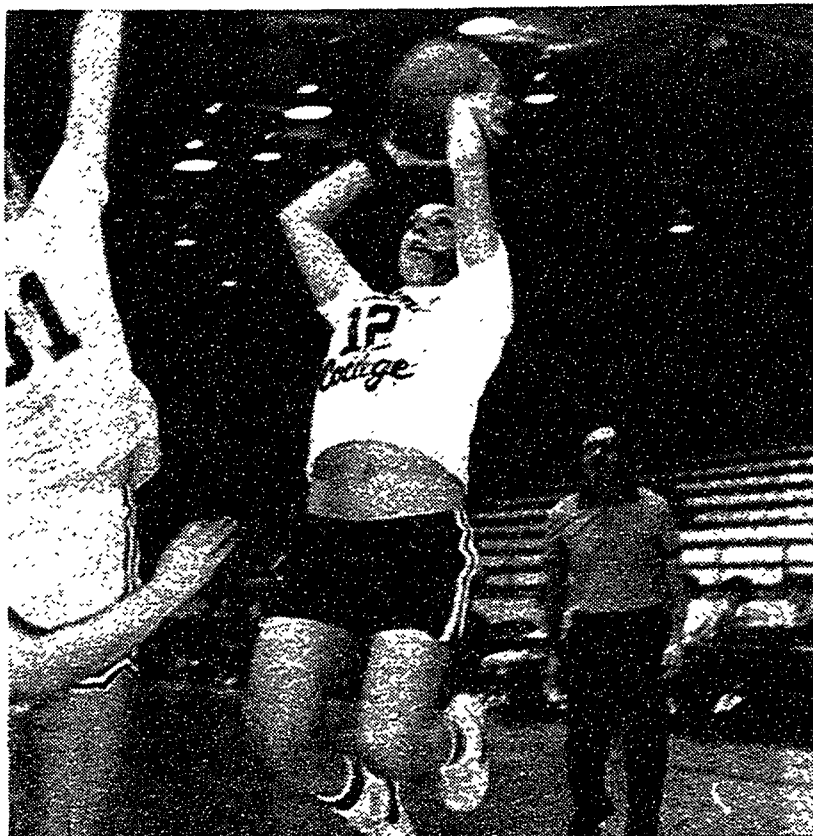
The Lady Cubs' next game is Saturday afternoon as they take on Grove City at Grove City.

Cubs Take Tourney

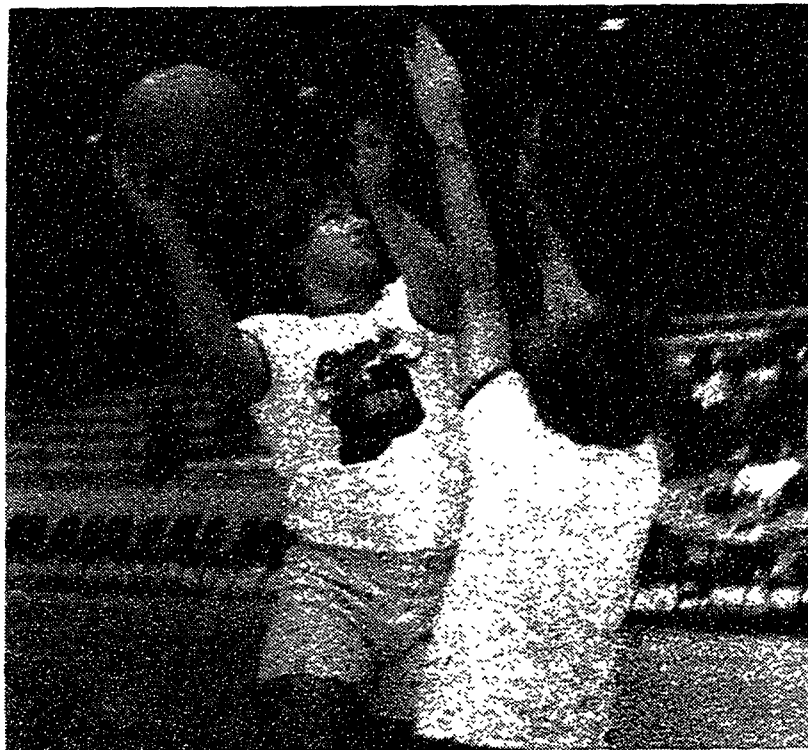
