A two-story multi-tier bookstack in the Behrend College Library will be constructed during the Summer Term.

All books in the Library will be packed and moved to other places upon the conclusion of the Spring Term. The Library services during the Summer Term will be restricted to: reserved materials, some periodicals and newspapers, audio-visual materials, photocopying, and interlibrary loan services.

Anyone planning to use library materials during Summer Term should send a list of materials to the Library by April 25, 1980, so that they may be on reserve.

Dr. Charles Kolb was recently promoted to Assistant Professor of Anthropology in the Division of Social and Behavioral Sciences.

Dr. Eva Tucker has accepted a NASA-ASEE Case Lewis Summer Faculty Fellowship for the Summers of 1980-81.

Diana George has received a grant from the Institute for the Arts and Humanistic Studies at U.P. As a result, Dr. George will be released from teaching duties Fall Term 1980 in order to work on her book, "Woman In Blake."

Captain Jeff Witherel, Assistant Professor of Military Science and Officer-in-Charge of Behrend ROTC, has been re-assigned by the army to the Intelligence and Security Board at Fort Huachuca, Arizona.

Dr. Robert Hostetler was an invited speaker at the PA Council of Teachers of Mathematics convention held in Pittsburgh, on March 29.

On March 26, Dr. Edwin Masteller presented a paper at the 28th Annual Meeting of the North American Benthological Society in Savannah, Georgia.

The Division of Social and Behavioral Sciences received a

grant of \$15,225 from the National Science Foundation for the project "Atmospheric Ionization Effects on the Serotonin Levels in Rats Under Various Stress Conditions." The proposal was prepared by Prof. Kiyoe Mizusawa. The project is interdisciplinary, requiring a team effort. Eight student participants are involved: two each in psychology, biology, chemistry, and engineering. They will be advised by K. Mizusawa, L. Balmer, L. Eckroat, E. Tucker, and J. Witherel. Paul Bailey will photograph the research progress.

Studio's "Anthology" To Open April 18

The Behrend College Theatre will open on April 18th with their Spring show "Spoon River Anthology" — a musical adaption of Edgar Lee Masters' famous Anthology, first published in 1915. This is the first attempt by the Theatre Department to stage a musical. Due to the intimate space of the Studio, there are very few musicals that can be staged there. Overall Director Paul Iddings, wanting to stage a play with music, dance, humor, and yet dramatically challenging, chose "Spoon River Anthology" which fits these requirements perfectly.

"Spoon River Anthology" is a kaleidoscope of monologues from ghosts, who were at one time citizens of Spoon River, Illinois, mourning and questioning their deaths, confessing their sins, and revealing the hidden sins of others. For example, one of the 80 characters in "Spoon River Anthology" is a ghost confessing his cheating ways and mourns his wife's faithfulness to him. Later, the wife steps from her tomb and confesses she knew of her

husband's infidelities all along. Portraying these 80 characters with humor and drama are four theatre majors — Diana Stark, Sue Klein, Mike Deely, and Randy Murzynski.

Linda Weber, Behrend's Instructor of Music, will direct the songs and musical numbers in "Spoon River Anthology" Linda feels the musical numbers are perfect for the Studio Theatre and are also topical and add greatly to the spectacle of Mr. Masters' work. Providing the musical talent in "Spoon River Anthology" are Joe Hohman, Joanne Pukanic, Nathan Spears, Nina DeFabbo, and Jay Nelson — five enthusiastic students who can not only sing but play several musical instruments.

"Spoon River Anthology" will be performed April 18-20; and the 23-27 at 8:00 p.m. and also at 2:30 p.m. on April 20 and 27. Behrend student and senior citizen prices are \$3.00, all others \$4.00. Tickets are on sale in Turnbull Hall, Division Office from 9 to 12 and 1 to 3, Monday through Friday.

Music Dept. Faces Busy Schedule

The Behrend Theatrical Department is featuring several Behrend musicians in its play, "The Spoon River Anthology", including Nina DeFabbo, Joe Hohman, Jay Nelson, Joanne Pukanic, and Nathan Spears. The production will run April 18-20 and April 23-27. Curtain time will be 8 p.m. each evening and in addition there will be 2:30 p.m. matinee shows on each of the two Sundays.

The Music Department is also lining up an additional concert in May, but has not yet set a date. In addition, there will also be periodic lunch-time mini-concerts in the RUB cafeteria.

"Run For Fun" Deadline Extended

Deadline for entries in the second annual Behrend College 10,000 Meter "Run For Fun" has been extended to Tuesday, April 22.

The challenging cross country run, which exposes runners to a wide variety of terrain and conditions, takes place Saturday, May 3, starting at 11 a.m.

The entire race takes place on the 425-acre Behrend campus, free from vehicular traffic. Splits and liquid refreshments will be

provided along the course. Last year's winning times were 35:00 for men, 43:05 for women.

Numerous prizes will be awarded in various age categories for both men and women, as well as several special categories. All entrants will receive T-shirts. Locker and shower facilities will be available.

Award ceremonies will be held following the race at the picnic pavilion at Behrend, where refreshments and picnic facilities

will be available for runners and their families and spectators.
