Junior Joanie Baker, who walked out on negotiations last season when not offered enough money, is currently playing out her option and will become a free agent at the season's end. Baker of Churchill High in Pittsburgh, is expected to be offered a signing bonus after the fall tournament. The rest of the talented rookies and their respected farm clubs are: Jill Franz of General McLane in Edinboro, Sharon Hines of Mt. Lebanon in Pittsburgh, Grace Novaisa of North East in western Pennsylvania, and Beth Pilkington of Cochranton. The Cubs also expect to bring up three more young players from their AAA team for the tournament. They are: Renee Harrison and Mary Toboz of Saegertown High School and Kim Wilson of Ft. LeBoeuf in Waterford. This combination of sensational veterans and exciting rookies should prove to be interesting and will provide an action-filled tournament and a promising spring!

The Lady Cubs volleyball team has been practicing hard for weeks now, getting ready for the fall edition of their intercollegiate sports program.






