Coach Zimmerman went to his bench throughout the game and got a lot of good help from Frank Swartz, Steve Kearney, Tony Hasson, and Bill Miklos. These four had a combined (5) points off the bench, which is outstanding. This is important for the coach to know he can go to his bench and they can get the job done. The Cubs went in the locker room with a 46-28 advantage. In the second half the Cubs again played good defense and hustled really well for loose balls. Greg Green and Frank Swartz controlled the boards for the Cubs. The Cubs were very organized offensively and got a lot of good inside shots. This victory helped the Behrend squad to feel more comfortable with each other on the floor and a sense of confidence

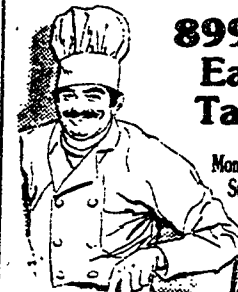

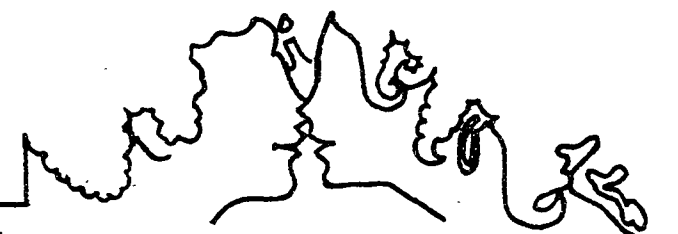
