Novelist Slated To Appear

Historical novelist George Garret was to give a free, public lecture Thursday at 8 p.m. in the Reed Lecture Hall.

Garrett, a professor of English and Senior Creative Writer at the University of Michigan, was to discuss his highly acclaimed novel *The Succession* and other works.

The Succession, a novel about the England of Elizabeth I published last year by Doubleday, received critical acclaim. *New York Times* book critic

Anatole Broyard said "In George Garret's hands, the brutality of 16th century history takes on a terrible gorgeousness And he gives us a lesson in contemporary politics that any historian might envy."

Similar accolades came from the *Washington Post*, *Newsweek*, the *Chicago Sun-Times Book Week*, and the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*. An earlier novel, *Death of the Fox*, also dealt with Elizabethian England.

A prolific writer, Garret has authored several other novels and numerous short stories and poems.

Garrett, a brother of Mrs. W. Craig (Alice) McClelland of Fairview Township, was educated at Sewanee Military Academy, the Hill School and Princeton University. His many honors include a Sewanee Review Fellowship, the Rome Prize of the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and a Ford Foundation Grant.
