Tuesday, Dec. 3, 8:00 p.m.

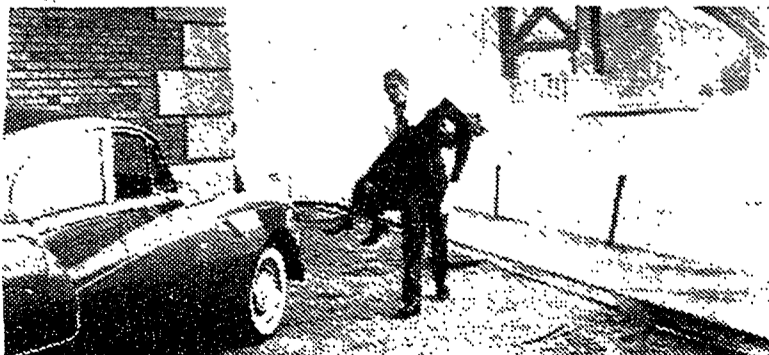
