### Police & Safety Services explains parking regulations

DIVISION OF POLICE AND SAFETY SERVICES

To help clear up any confusion on the parking regulations here on campus, please note the following information:

All students are required to purchase parking permits (at the Police and Safety Office, South Cottage). This may appear contrary to a recent letter sent to students advising otherwise. The letter in question, however, was for Commonwealth Campus's only, and Behrend is not a Commonwealth Campus.

Students are not to park in visitors and/or Staff parking areas at any time, which includes the lots immediately behind the residence halls (except behind Perry Hall). Parking in the Reed Lot is permitted by students with valid parking permits every day from 6:30 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. and anytime Saturday and Sunday. Any other times are in violation. Students may park in any of the student lots, provided they have a valid parking permit.

Parking along the roadway or on the grass is not allowed. The only exception to this is when if all

the student lots are filled completely. Parking at all times should not create a hazardous situation.

If you have a visitor coming on campus to see you, make sure that they pick up a temporary parking permit (which for visitors is no charge) at the Police and Safety Office. Visitors are not permitted in any staff lots of spaces.


