This form must be filed in conjunction with the STATE GRANT-FEDERAL GRANT application in order to be considered for all types of University Aid (SEOG, NDSL, CWSP). The filing deadline is April 1.

UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP (3.0 GPA and

This application must be submitted for academic scholarship consideration by March 1. Students must also submit financial information (through STATE-FEDERAL application) by Feb. 15.

OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS FINANCIAL AID FORM

For the 86-87 academic year,

out-of-state students must file the FAF in order to be considered for federal aid, as well as university administered aid in conjunction with the university aid application. To assure consideration for

the university administered aid,

the FAF should be submitted by Feb. 15.

STATE AID

The following states allow their aid to be used in Pennsylvania: Alaska, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland, Massachusetts, Ohio, Rhode Island, Vermont, and West Virginia. Students from these states should file for aid by the various deadlines designated. Applications are available in the Financial Aid Office.

UNIVERSITY FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION AND UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS -

Applications and deadlines are the same as for Pennsylvania residents. Students must submit financial information by using the FAF by Feb. 15.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

-The above applications should be submitted as soon as possible. Applications submitted after the deadline will be considered as funds are available.

-In anticipation of federal Verification Regulations, it is suggested that all students make a photocopy of both parents and students 1985 U.S. Income Tax Return before mailing. These documents may be required before 1986-87 aid is finalized.

-Students receiving aid are required to make satisfactory academic progress. Satisfactory academic standards for federal aid are defined on pages 39 and 40 of "Policies and Rules for Students". Individual concerns may be addressed in the Financial Aid Office.

Don't get caught in the cold.


