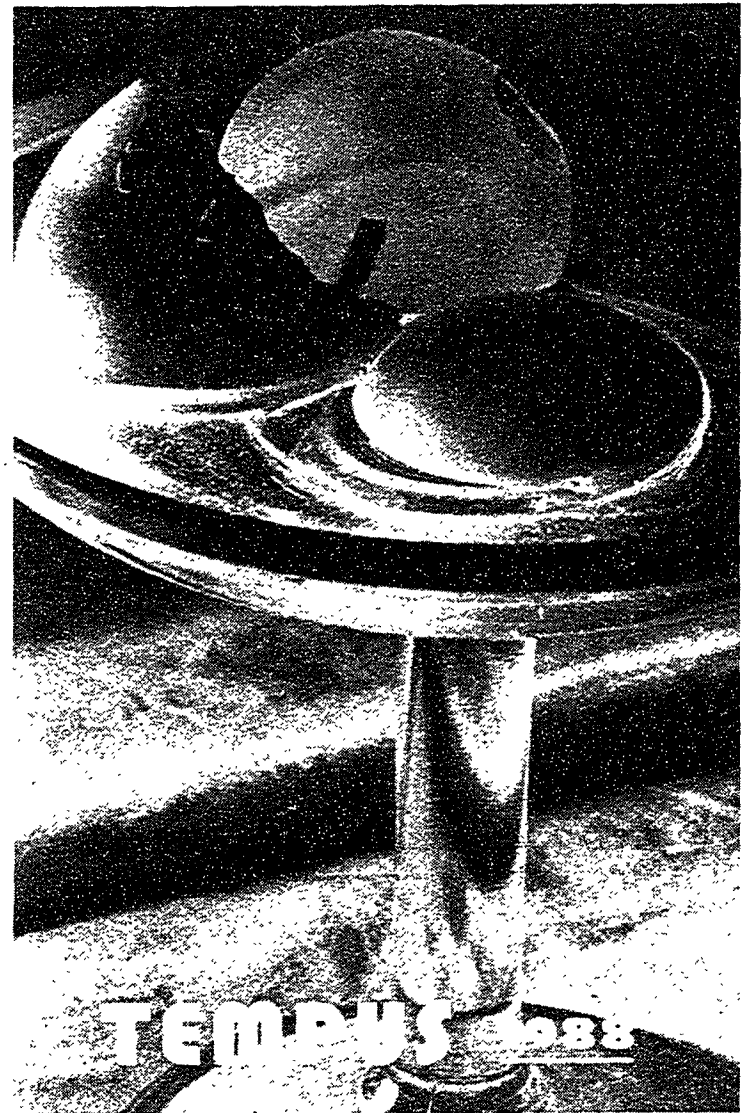

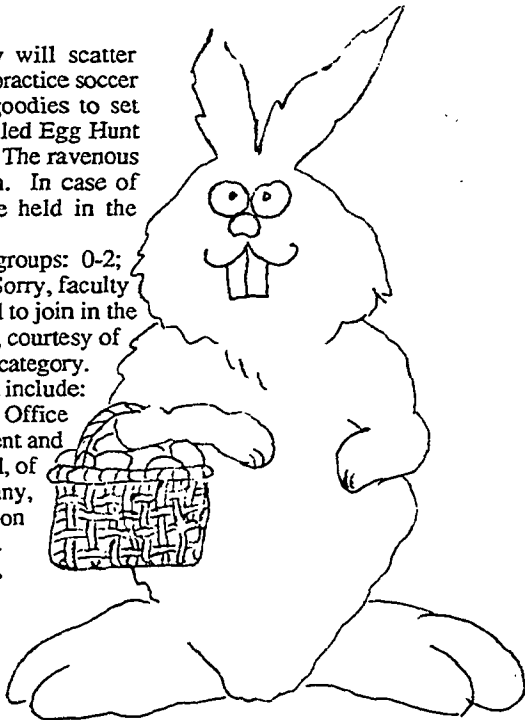


The Cover of the 1988 Tempus. Due out in late April.

"jettison their family lives." While Ellen Goodman does frequently deal with national politics in her column, it was not a primary topic in her lecture. Observers often point out that her focus is part of what makes her unique as a columnist. Whereas most syndicated columnists deal mainly with current news events and political issues, Goodman is not afraid to dive headfirst into social issues that few others dare to tackle. "Sometimes I write what I call social work columns...the kind of thing I write about because it needs written and nobody else is going to do it," said Goodman. Though Ellen Goodman dealt mostly with the changes that women have realized, she is not at all unsympathetic to the problems of the modern male. "The expectations have risen for men as well," she noted, pointing out that today's man is expected to be strong, but not silent, sensitive and, "able to leap tall emotional buildings in a single bound."
