After Father Linden's speech, the audience began to ask questions. A great deal of misunderstanding occured between the stage and the audience. Father Linden's answers reflected a high emotional involvement. Judging from the audience reaction. Father Linden's answers were unsatisfactory, dealing more in the philosophical implications of the case, than in the actual facts.

At this point, Tom Minnicker, from the Harrisburg Counsel, came out and spoke on behalf of the three Baltimore priests. "All will enter pleas of NOT GUILTY", Minnicker said. He confirmed that the government cannot prove the conspiracy. He reiterated that there was no such plot, and that these "men are Not Guilty. After Minnicker's speech, the audience became enthusiastic. Many signed for the Vigil and Rally, and many contributed money. Times for the Vigil will be 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Thursday and 10:00 a.m. to noon on Friday. On Thursday night, a film on Dan Berrigan will be shown at 8:00 p.m., in the Function Room of the HACC Student Union Building. On Friday, January 29th, there will be a Rally at noontime on the Capitol steps. About thirty members of the Capitol Campus community were in attendance at the meeting Sunday.

Critic's Notebook ZABRISKI POINT or THE DECLINE AND FALL OF MICHELANGELO ANTONIONI AS PERFORMED BY A CREW OF RANK AMATEURS

Sloane It would be difficult to isolate the absolute Worst Film of 1970, for such would involve hours of agony passed in sleazy drive-ins as Vincent Price turns a laser beam on Elvis Presley making love to Annette Funicello. Let us then consider one sub-category: The Most Arrogant Film of the Year, Zabriski Point. Inexperienced actors and actresses having been handed leading roles, it would have been less insulting to us and to them had the director at least tried to exact a semblance of characterization. In this case Signor Antonioni achieves a passable line-reading, though at times we could have sworn he movies, but most are have the camera act merely as an observer." It would have been less insulting had the cameraman been awake. Seeming to have achieved now has moved on to another level: simple atrocity. If cinema of the absurd is done cleverly enough it may be possible to cover up certain structural

was holding up cue cards. Several scenes are direct plagiarisms from other, better unfortunately original. "Let a pair of kids cavort in the desert," says this brand of streamy-consciousness, "and have the camera act merely as an sufficient mediocrity at simple surrealism (Blow-Up), Antonioni

weaknesses. When the construction of a work is so blatantly third-rate that one winces in embarrassment, it's time to go home.

Remember the fabulous films of the thirties in which a newspaper headline would come spinning out onto the screen? How far we have progressed! Antonioni unifies his effort with screaming radio newscasts, as unskillfully done as possible. The story itself is completely predictable, with each move obviously pointing the next. There is no climax, and at least three adequate stopping points are ignored as the film creaks on. Zabriski Point substitutes mistake for mystique; there are such unprofessional errors that one cannot consider them accidental. This is pure audience-contempt. Antonioni takes for granted that a genius can receive only praise, even as a garbage collector. He won't have the opportunity to dump on us again. Facial Features Syndicate, 1971.
