Northeastern Christian J. C. came to Capitol Campus on January 18 expecting to play in

a basketball game. What they played more resembled a demolition derby. In a record breaking contest, the Capitol Campus Lions steamrolled to a 124 to 75 win. It was the first win against three loses for the Lions. The team really put it together and absolutely obliterated their opponent.

Many records were set or equaled in the contest. Capitol's 124 points exceeded the previous team high of 106 set against York College in 1969. The victory margin of 49 markers tied a school record. New records also set for the team were: most rebounds; best field goal percentage; and best free throw percentage.

Paul Hook, the 6 foot 2 inch center set the pace with 28 points. Joe Duda followed with 21 and Larry Chupka had 16 points. 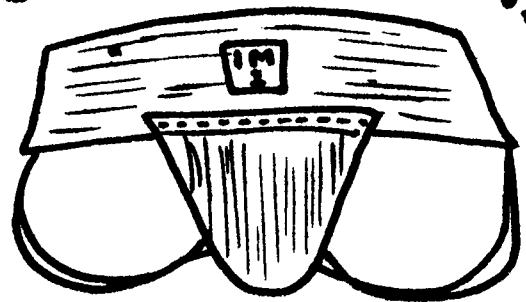
