



Classical Guitarist Opens Festival

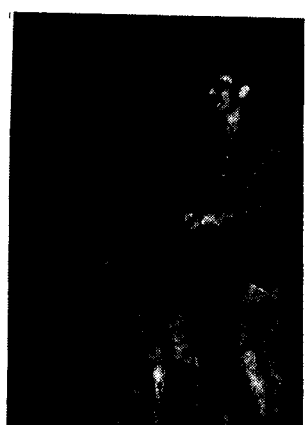
