anything that can be seen by the eye and even those things which it cannot. Color infrared film portrays the world in a palette of cyan and magenta, generated by the energy of heat. Recording film reduces an image to elemental graininess-inherent in all films as silver halide particles, but in this case only more so. So in a sense, different films help the photographer fit different states of mind, further enhancing the creative qualities of photography.

To photograph, your equipment need not be lavish. Photographs are made by people with cameras, not by cameras alone. Even the simplest camera in the right hands can produce a memorable image. Specialized lenses and cameras only serve to broaden a photographer's ability to capture the fleeting image on film in order to document existence.

Photography can be very rewarding in that the end product can be shared with others, and satisfaction from your work can be met by the approval of others. The possibility also exists that your work will not meet such a kind fate. If this happens, you can put your prints in a box and show them to no one, confident that you have satisfied yourself.

In the end, that's what photography is all about, self-expression. For me at least, seeing is living, because photography is my life.

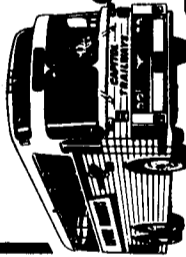
