

After almost being left for dead, America has returned from a sojourn in England with a nice bit of resurrection called Holiday. America, never known particularly for originality, has managed to attain a bit of individuality in some of the cuts on this new

I don't know if the reason for the freshness of this album is the return of America to their spawning grounds, or their enlistment of George Martin (who used to produce a group called - ah, let's see - the Beatles) as their producer. Whatever it is, America has turned their tired, old one-dimensional sound into a much nicer two-D sound, with even deeper parts when Martin is allowed to let

They still sound like their trying to sound like somebody that sounds like C,S,N&Y, but this time, they don't seem to force it on us as much. The nicest part of the album is the single bit formed by the opening two cuts ("Miniature", an instrumental, and "Tin Man", a top-40 entry). However, there are a couple of other high spots, the main one being "Glad To See You", a fine example of both America and their producer at their collective best.

On the whole, Holiday is a pleasant-sounding album that promises much for this rather talented crew. It's nice to know that they have their very own style (frail as it may be). I can only hope this Holiday turns out to be more permanent.
