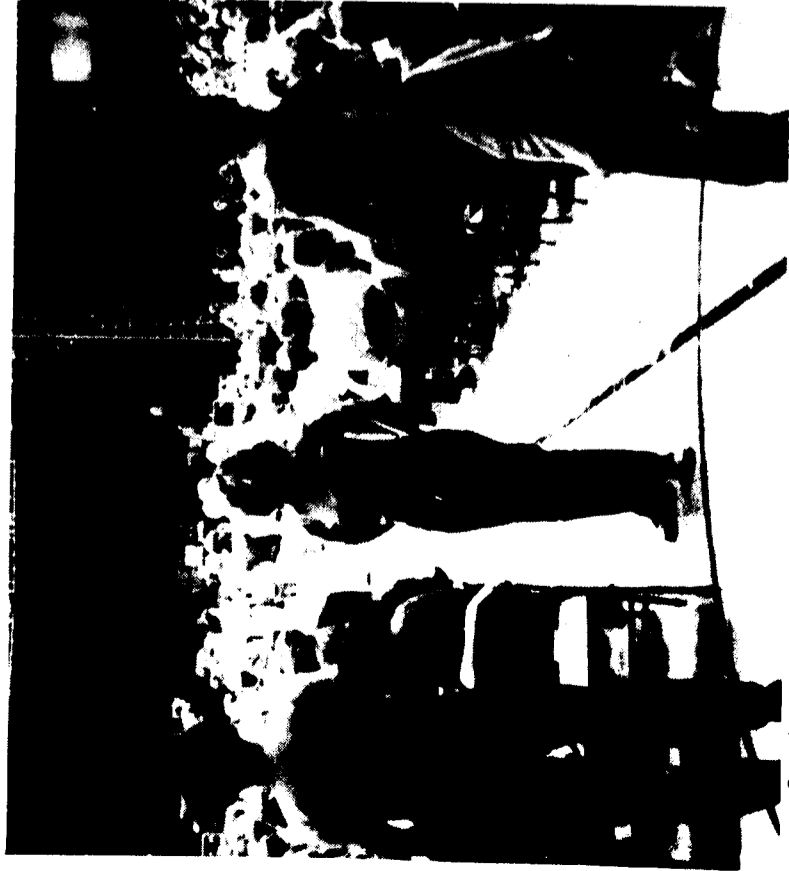




Maryland's Walt White [85] scores his [and his team's] first of two TD's against Penn State in a 24-17 loss on ALL-U Day

Crowd gathers for All-U Day concert featuring Loggins & Messina.

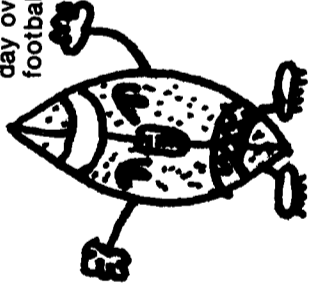
ALL-U DAY
