TABLE TENNIS LADDER TOURNEY:



The battle was staged on the athletic field behind the Placement Center and a good sized crowd watched as Capitol dominated VF by a score of 5:1. The second half opened with substitutions for both teams.

Jeff Hooten replaced Rick Burnfield in goal, Randy Hess and Jim Swope replaced Ed Mirabello and Bill Turner, respectively, for Capitol. The second half saw only one goal scored, but it was a little unusual. Randy Hess, playing outside right for Capitol, passed to center forward, Mounir Azar, but Mounir's shot deflected off of the goal post and was tapped in by Armand Magnelli, who was conveniently left unattended. Jeff Hooten made some fantastic saves at goal and Bob Schmidt, playing Center Halfback, foiled every attack up the middle by Valley Forge Military Academy.

Capitol Campus ended its soccer season with a (3-4-2) record, but I really do not feel that it is reflective of the team's ability and personality.
