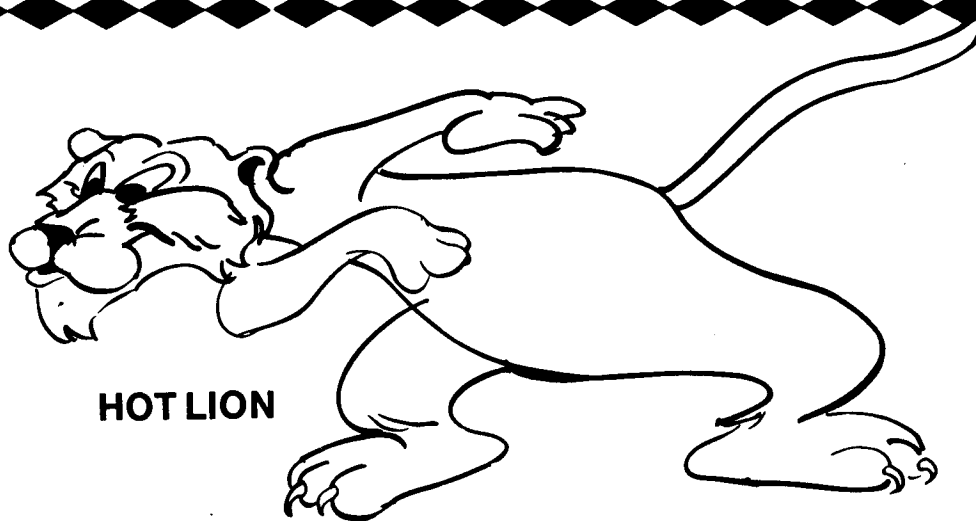

Dance Residency Begins Next Week



Raymond Johnson, Dance Instructor in Residence

Capitol Campus will present a unique, one week performing arts program Feb. 17 to 21 featuring Raymond Johnson, dancer and choreographer.

A professional dancer since 1963, Johnson has performed in concerts, opera, television and film. He toured for eight years with the Murray Louis and Alwin Nikolais companies. Recently he founded the Raymond Johnson Dance Company and has created works for both solo and

company performances. Mr. Johnson comes to Middletown through the cooperation of Affiliate Artists, Inc. and Penn State Capitol Campus.

Johnson's week long appearance at Capitol will include theatre dance presentations, modern dance classes, a program for children and daily seminars. All programs are free and open to the public.

Highlights of the program will be an Introduction to Dance in the audi-

torium on Monday, Feb 17 at 12 noon; a program for children at the base gym on Tuesday the 18th at 6:30 p.m.; and a Theatre Dance Presentation in the auditorium on Friday the 21st at 8 p.m. Mr. Johnson will give a lecture demonstration at HACC on Wednesday the 19th from 12 noon to 7 p.m.
