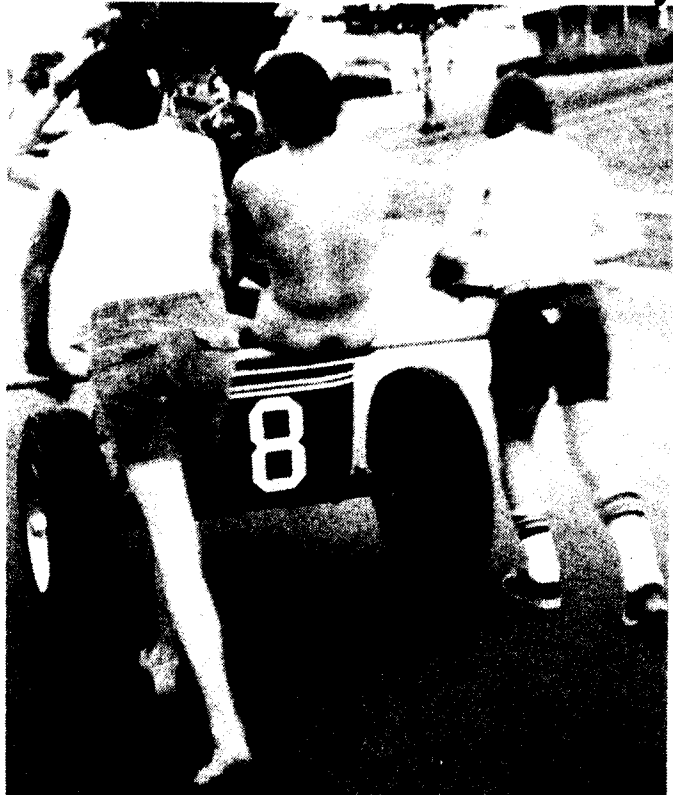


Bathtub Race Is Wednesday

According to Don Miller, coordinator of the event,

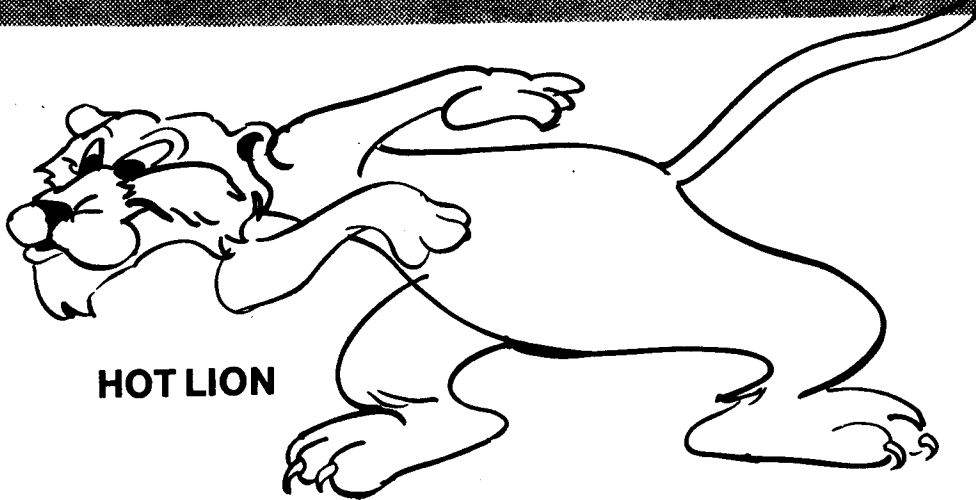
each tub will have a driver and 10 pushers.
