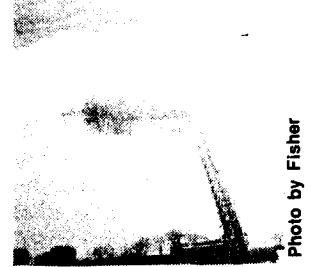

Meade Heights from 1000 feet.

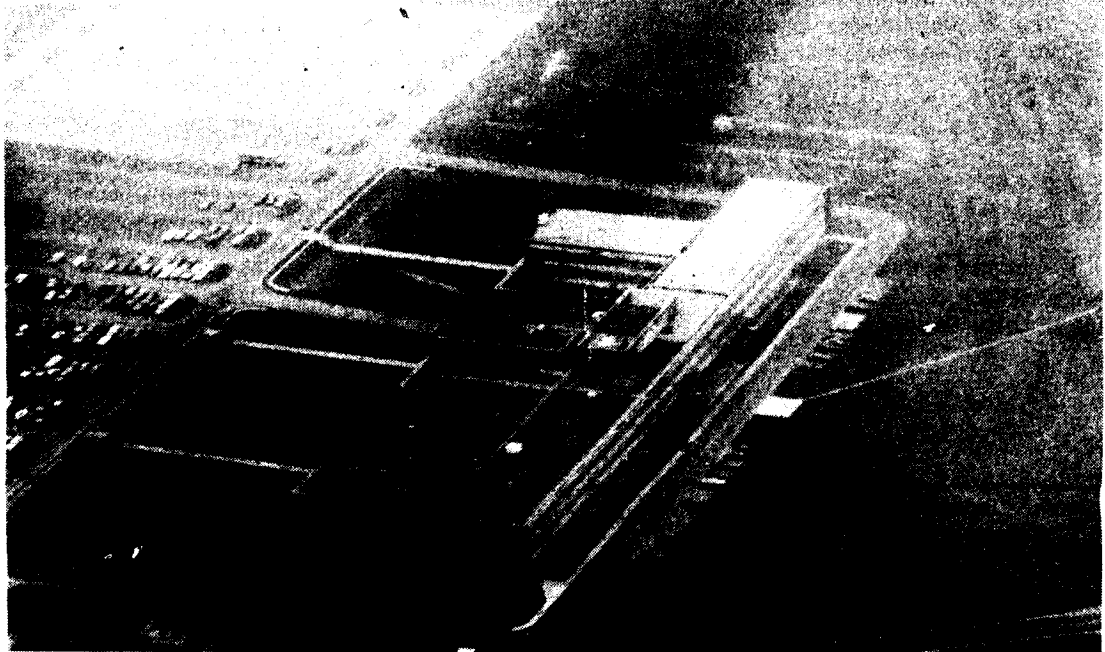

The main event on Aviation Day was the airplane ride. Once in the air, Capitolites gained views of their campus not normally attainable. Here is a God's-eye view of the main building.

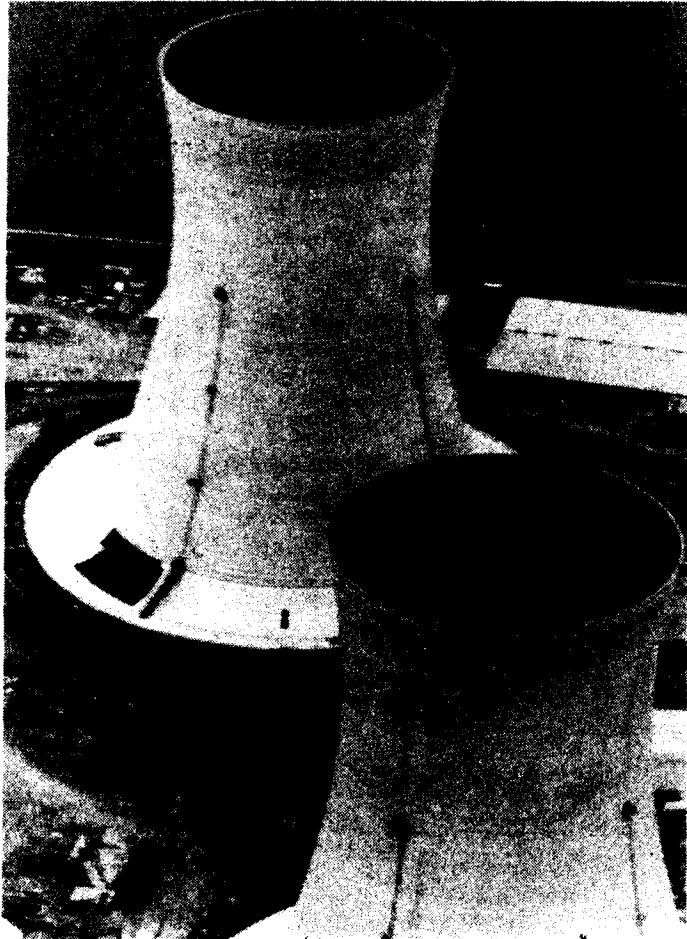

Contestants head for their vehicles at the start of the annual Bathtub Race. The race was held in conjunction with the Rites of Spring.

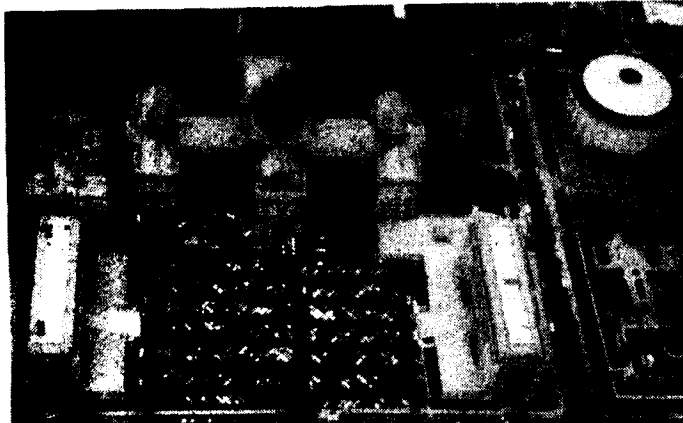
