Four faculty members at Capitol Campus have been selected as Outstanding Educators of America for 1975.

Chosen were Dr. Roger Saylor, Dr. George D. Wolf, Dr. Carolyn Dexter and Dr. Robert Bresler.

Dr. Roger Saylor, a Hummelstown resident, has taught at Penn State University since 1947 and has been professor of economics and statistics at Capitol Campus since 1967.

The first faculty member appointed at Capitol Campus in 1966, Dr. George D. Wolf has been dean of faculty since 1973.

Dr. Carolyn Dexter, assistant professor of social science and sociology, was a founder and past president of the Central Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Marketing Association.
