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Major Changes To B.E.O.G. Policy

During the 1976-77 academic year the Federal Basic Educational Opportunity Program (BEOG) will be open to all undergraduates regardless of when they began their post-secondary education. This represents a major change in this grant program.

BEOG is federal financial aid which forms the "base" of a student's financial aid

package. PHEAA (State Grants), University and private forms of financial assistance are meant to supplement one's Basic Grant. Consequently, all Capitol Campus Financial Aid Applicants must file a BEOG application for the 1976-77 year. They are available in the lobby of the Admissions and Placement Building.

Don't Gripe, Run Instead

Election of executive officers and senators for the Student Government Association (S.G.A.) will be held Tuesday April 13. The positions are: president, vice president, treasurer, secretary and senior senators.

"Instead of complaining about the troubles on campus, students should run for an office or at the very least vote," said Election Screening Chairman, Rick Laychock.

The duties of the offices include the following: President: To correlate the ideas

of the senators. To represent the student body at administrative, faculty and student affairs meetings. The main representative of students on and off Capitol Campus. Vice President: Takes over the duties of the President if necessary. Chairperson of the President's Council and correlates all campus activities with the organization presidents and the Social Committee.

Treasurer: Chairperson of the financial committee. Decides, with the help of the Senate, how much money is to be allotted to each campus organization and keeps all financial records. Secretary: Keeps the minutes of the meetings and distributes pertinent information. Also included in the job is public relations writing and press releases for the college newspaper. Senators: Represent the students. Bring their constituents' ideas and suggestions to meetings. Also serves on faculty committees as student representatives and as chairpersons of SGA committees.

Petitions for candidates are available in W-110 (SGA office) and must be returned no later than March 29.

Candidates must be a senior next year and be a full time student. People having any questions concerning the election or any of the offices should contact Rich Laychock or Scott Deardorff at the SGA office.
