Tarnhelm...the creative voice of Capitol Campus.

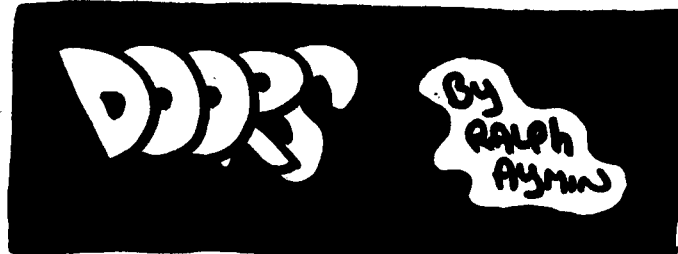
