

# Take Time To Register To Vote

After scheduling classes and buying books, college students should take a few minutes to register to vote.

That's the advice of Commonwealth Secretary Barton A. Fields who says that 18 to 25-year-olds have largely ignored their right to vote.

"College students are often

particularly well-informed on the issues of the day, but they seem to neglect their right to vote," Mr. Fields said.

"Political decisions affect many areas of a student's life such as the tuition rate at state-supported and state-related colleges and universities, and the amount of state scholarship money available. It

seems to me that college students should take an interest in choosing office holders whose decisions will directly affect their lives."

For those potential voters who are unsure of how to register and vote, the Department of State offers the following short course in voter education.

## 1] Do I register where I live or where I go to school?

You may register either as an elector of the county in which you live or you may register as an elector of the county in which you attend school. The choice is up to you.

## 2] How do I register?

Register by appearing in person at the appropriate county court house or, more simply, by obtaining and filling out a voter registration by mail form. Many college book stores and student unions will have forms available. Forms can also be obtained at various public places such as libraries, post offices, court houses and state stores. Mail registration forms are preaddressed and postage paid.

## 3] Is there a deadline for voter registration?

In order to vote in the November 7 election, you must register by Tuesday, October 10. Persons who will be 18 or before November 8 are eligible to register.

## 4] Can I vote by absentee ballot?

If you will be out of the county where you are registered on Election Day, Tuesday November 7, you may request an absentee ballot either by appearing in person at the appropriate county court house or by mailing a signed request for an absentee ballot to the court house. You may apply for an absentee ballot between September 18 and October 31. When your application is approved, the county will mail your absentee ballot to you.

## 5] Who will be up for election this November?

On Tuesday, November 7, Pennsylvanians will elect a governor and lieutenant governor, all representatives to Congress, all representative to State House, and the 25 State Senators from even numbered districts.

# Workshops/Mini Courses

The Continuing Education Program at Penn State-Capitol Campus announced several workshops and mini-courses for October.

### Construction Company Management

A one-day seminar entitled "Construction Company Management" is being held Tuesday, October 17. The class will be held on campus in the conference room of the Multi-Purpose Building from 8:30 am to 5 pm.

The purpose of this seminar is to acquaint construction company managers with wasteful cost areas and hidden expenditures that go unnoticed. The course also highlights effects of the current shortages and spiraling costs that cut into industry profits.

Registration should be made by October 10. The fee of \$65 covers all instructional costs, course materials, lunch and coffee breaks.

### The Preparation and Trial of a Fraud Arson Case

A two-day minicourse on "The Preparation and Trial of a Fraud Arson Case" will be held Thursday and Friday, October 19 and 20 from 8:30 am to 4 pm.

The program is designed to educate all persons interested in proving the existence of fraud and arson.

Presentations by private investigators, accountants, insurance brokers, state and local fire investigators and trial attorneys will acquaint participants

with the duties, responsibilities and functions of each profession.

The fee is \$45 and includes all instructional materials and lunches. Deadline for registration is Thursday, October 5.

### Beginners Archery Clinic

A "Beginners Archery Clinic" will be held on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 7 to 9 pm, October 2 through 25.

This clinic is designed for beginning players. Topics to be covered are: the basic skills of archery, equipment evaluation, bow explanation (recurve and compound), warm-up exercises, and many others.

The fee for the clinic is \$30 and participants should supply their own equipment. Deadline for registration is Friday, September 29.

### Individual Self-Improvement for Secretaries

The workshop "Individual Self-Improvement for Secretaries" will be held on Wednesday, October 11 from 8:30 am to 4 pm.


This program is designed to help the secretary develop an awareness of and sensitivity to personal goals, values, and attitudes and the role they play in job satisfaction and performance. Emphasis is placed upon the need to understand personal goal and value orientations and their impact upon our relations with others.

The fee of \$45 includes the cost of instruction, materials, coffee breaks and lunch. Deadline for registration is Monday, October 9.


