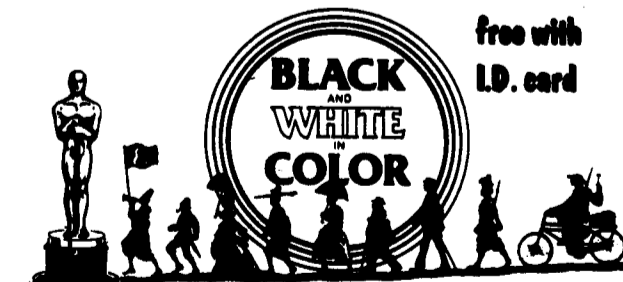
said that this would be more economical than holding a concert off-campus, since high rates of rental for another location would not have to be paid.
