Also figuring to improve PSU/ Capitol on the court are the results of the vigorous recruiting effort of Athletic Director Buc Smitley. Several top-notch players are expected to don the Blue and White next year.

As for the season now behind us, the entire campus

community can be proud of the efforts of Jack Wilson, Ron Kuzo, Bennett Fox, Bob Hudrick, Bob Hassel, Bernie Walko, Cliff Lewis, and Lowell Jensen. They carried themselves extremely well through a tough year, never giving in to the opposition. This never-say-die attitude was firmly in place when the Lions took the floor last Tuesday evening for their season finale against host Spring Garden. Remembering all too well how the Bobcats ran up the score against them in an earlier meeting in Middletown, PSU/ Capitol broke out to an early lead, which Spring garden could not overtake until less than ten minutes were remaining in the opening half.

The Bobcats pulled away from that point for another large margin of victory over PSU/ Capitol, but the Lions never stopped hustling until the final buzzer of the season sounded. And that is how this year's Lions should be remembered. Not just by their victories and defeats, but by their desire and determination; their courage, class, and character. If it really does not matter whether you win or lose, just how you played the game, then this season's PSU/ Capitol basketball team are national champions.


