1980-81 Resident Assistant Selections Begins

A meeting for all persons interested in becoming Resident Assistants during the next academic year was held Tuesday evening, April 8, 1980, at 7:00 p.m. in the Gallery Lounge. The duties and responsibilities of Resident Assistants were discussed, followed by the distribution of applications. Refreshments were available to allow for informal questions and answers at the end of the session.

Those who were unable to attend may pick up applications from their Resident Assistant, from the Wisberg Hall Office, or from the Residence Living Office at 946A Kirtland Avenue.

The screening of candidates for the Resident Assistant position is based on peer review on the part of current Resident Assistants and members of the residence governing organizations; evaluations of each candidate by the Faculty Program Heads, the Student Affairs Staff, and the Department of Housing and Food Service, and references submitted by each candidate.

Among other qualities and competencies sought in applicants are an ability to relate to others in an effective and mature fashion; an ability to counsel and advise on personal and school-related problems; knowledge of Campus and community resources for referral and informational purposes; an ability to assume a disciplinary role when necessary; and a positive attitude toward the entire Campus community, its spirit, and its potential.

Screening of applicants includes a review of the application, references and group interview performance. Final selection of appointees will be made from a list of qualified candidates submitted to Patricia Murphy, Coordi-

nator, Residence Living Program, and Dr. James D. South, Director of Student Affairs.

Qualified candidates remaining on the list will be considered for alternacy to R.A. positions which may become available during the 1980-81 academic year. Appointments are announced following the release of Spring Term grades at the end of June.

Persons submitting applications must have a 2.00 cumulative grade point average, and must be attending classes at the Capitol Campus at the time of filing the application. In addition, they should obtain a request for Fall Term housing from the Housing Office, and submit it along with the \$45.00 advance deposit to the Finance Office.

Interested persons should feel free to contact any member of the Residence Living Program Staff for further information. The deadline for filing applications for the Resident Assistant position is Friday, April 18, 1980 in the RLPO.

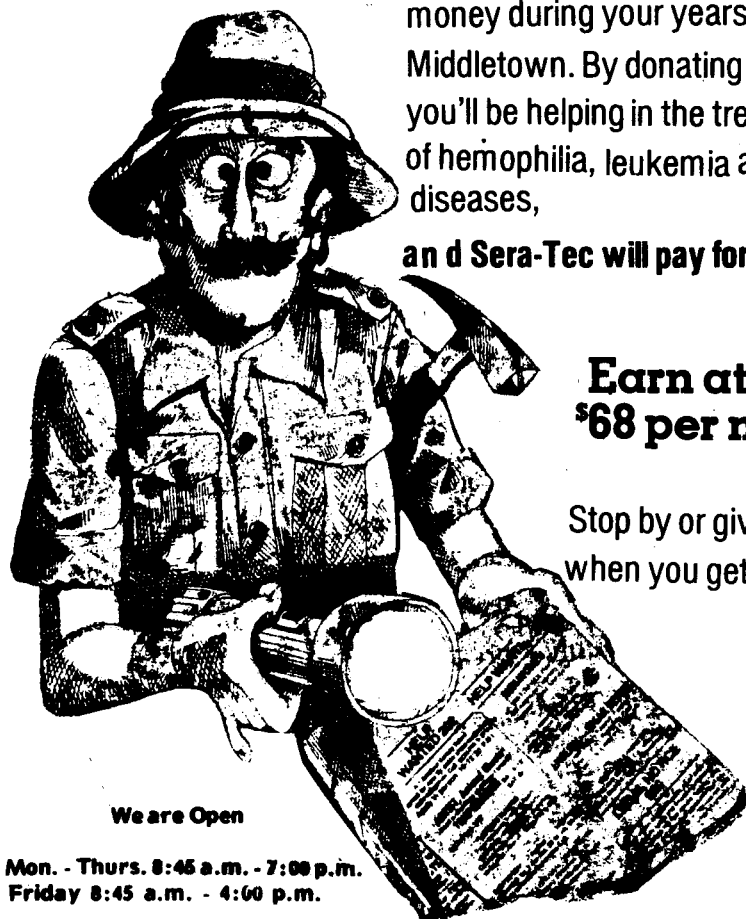
