WSBA WINS AWARD

WSBA has won an Armstrong Award for its news coverage of Three Mile Island. The Awards, now in their sixteenth year, are named after Professor Edwin Howard Armstrong, who invented a number of electronic circuits, including FM, which make modern communications possible.

Administered by the Armstrong Memorial Research Foundation of Columbia University, the Armstrong Awards are given annually to those AM and FM stations that demonstrate excellence and originality in broadcasting.

Previously WSBA had received national recognition by the Radio/Television News Directors Association -- Edward R. Murrow and National Headliners Awards, also for the station's Three Mile Island reporting.
