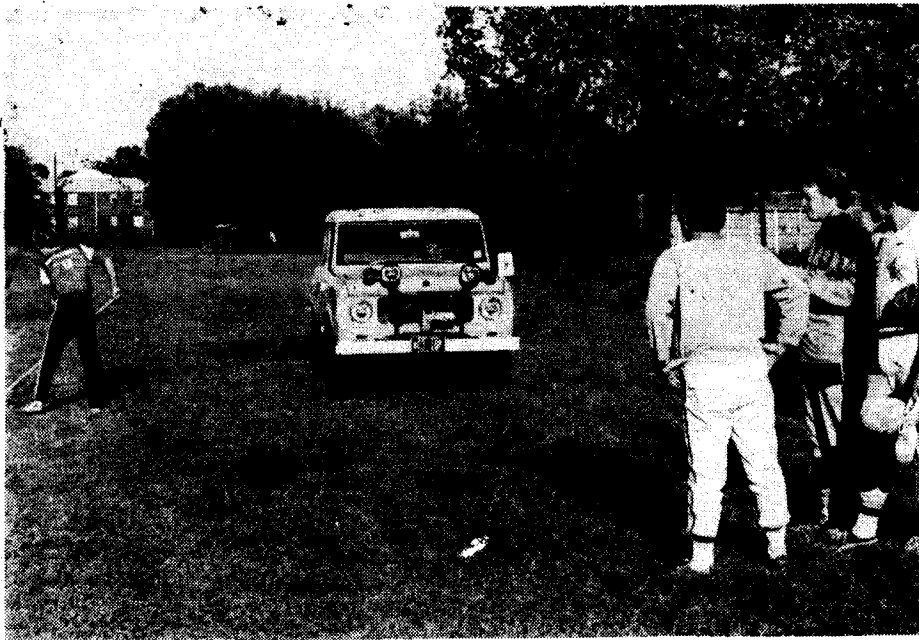
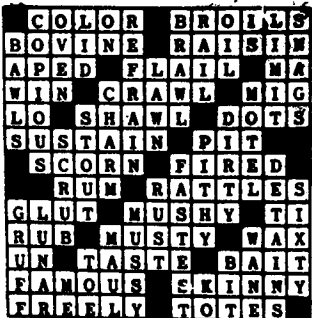

The U.S. Postal Service hopes to increase efficiency by cutting costs, while speeding mail deliveries, by expanding its Zip Code system to nine digits.

The change (from its present five numbers) will mean a cost of thousands of dollars to change mailing addresses, and there is controversy as to what good it will do.

The director of the Office of Zip Code, who promotes the change, hopes it will be effected by February.

The Post Office contends that the change would make it possible for machines to "read" the numbers. The mail would be pre-sorted, targeted even to the floor of the building its recipient lives on.

Opponents of the plan argue that such a move would neither cut cost nor speed delivery but, instead, would increase new equipment cost by \$1 billion. Increased costs to businesses would also amount to \$1 billion. In addition, many private citizens feel the nine digits would be too hard to remember.

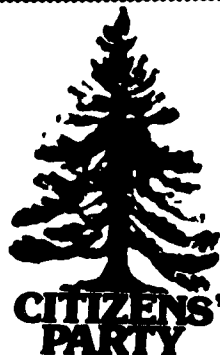
