Speaking of wrestling, the girls can come watch the guys wrestle. I think the

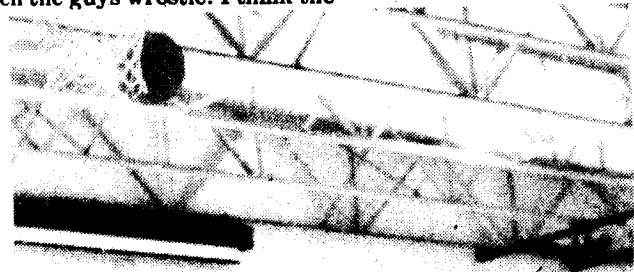
