Eligibility is limited to students who have at least one full-time term completed of Penn State graduate study. These competitive grants are awarded each term through the University Park Graduate Fellowship Office.

FINANCIAL AID NEWS

Applications are now being accepted in the Admissions/Financial Aid Office for possible summer job openings on campus, through departmental budgets. Eligibility for these possible jobs is not based on financial need. Positions may

be available through the Maintenance Department, for general maintenance or groundskeeping assignments. Other departments also occasionally hire students in the summer (for instance, the library). If you wish to file an application for a summer position, complete the summer wage-payroll job application in Admissions, Room 214, Multi-Purpose Building, as soon as possible.

You may also wish to file a late application for summer work/study employment (based on financial need), if you have not already done so.
