Government officials deny any connection with the raid that resulted in a substantial loss of weaponry.

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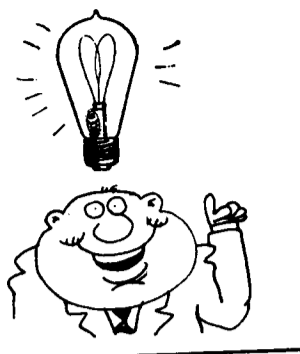
At the time of the raid, EKM warriors were engaged in regrouping procedures from the last Anon battle which claimed the starbase.

Meeting place denied

The University of San Francisco has denied a women's group a place to meet on their campus because the group admits to having lesbian members.

The school cited Roman Catholic belief in the "sinfulness of homosexual behavior."

The group involved was the National Women's Studies Association.

The head of the association called the move "an unprecedented act of discrimination against an academic body."

A university spokesman said the university consistently refuses to recognize all homosexual organizations. The school is affiliated with the Roman Catholic church.

The association does not plan on suing the school over the issue. Six other California schools offered the group use of their facilities for the June, 1982, conference. 2,000 women are expected at the meeting.
