Clem Gilpin, adviser to BSU, points out there are many black history events scheduled in the Harrisburg area, not just on Capitol Campus. "Bell of Pennsylvania has an exhibit at Strawberry Square, while City Hall in Harrisburg plans to display an exhibit for black history month in its new

facilities."

The Dauphin County Library System will sponsor a series of lectures at the Central (State) Library at Front and Walnut Streets each Sunday in February at 2 p.m. For example, on February 20, the topic will be "300 Years of Black History in South Central Pennsylvania," given by Dr. Leroy Hopkins.

The library system is involved in touring a play produced by a local black theatre group. "Anoche Has His Day," will be presented at the Northern Dauphin Branch, Hershey Public Library, East Shore Branch and the Kline Village Branch. Designed for youngsters in the first through sixth grades, the play is presented by the Mlanjeni Magical Theatre and is free to the public.

Shippensburg State College will host a black dance group. The Brenda Lee Dance Troup will perform in the Cumberland Union Building on Saturday, February 26, at 9 p.m., for a small fee.

President Reagan in his 1981 address to the black community made his feelings known to the nation about black history:

"The observance of the Afro-American (Black) History Month serves to focus national attention on an endeavor of awareness that should follow us throughout the year... Their struggles, achievements and perseverance help us understand the moral fiber of America and our commitment to freedom, equality and justice."

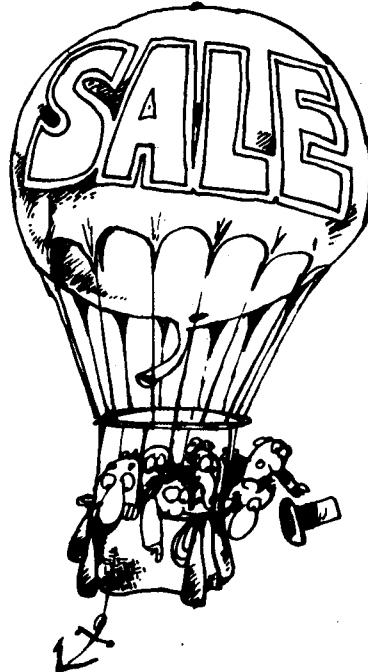
