The Health Fair will allow students, faculty and the general public to become more acquainted with their bodies, through medical tests, demonstrations and general information provided by representatives and organizations throughout the Harrisburg area.

According to Jim Dickson, President of PHI SIGMA CHI, this year's Fair will not only give students the opportunity to receive free medical consultations and testing, but a chance to have some fun at the same time.

Demonstrations and testing will be provided by organizations such as Harrisburg Hospital, Community General Osteopathic Hospital, The Polyclinic Medical Center for Speech and Hearing, who bring to us the opportunity to receive auditory testing, a new edition to the Fair, as well as the Central Pennsylvania Lung Association.

This year's Fair will offer information and testing in areas such as dental testing for plaque, anemia and blood sugar testing, blood pressure screening and biofeedback for smokers.

In addition to free medical information and testing, the Fair will sponsor aerobic dancing from the Aerobics Co., free haircuts and manicures from the Empire Beauty School and facials from Cosmetics by Rita.

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
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
