

Tischler named Director of Summer session

The appointment of Dr. Nancy Tischler as director for the University's entire summer sessions will be taking her away from teaching at Capitol Campus for the coming year 1983-84.

Dr. John W. Oswald, University President, appointed the Capitol Campus Professor of English and Humanities to the position which is effective July 1, 1983. Tischler's responsibility will be coordinating all summer programs that will be offered by the university in 1984-85 and 86.

Speaking about her new appointment Tischler said, "There hasn't been a director since back in the old days when there was a semester system. My job will be to coordinate all summer programs for all campuses in the University."

The key word here is coordinate. Dr. Tischler will not be directly involved with the Capitol Campus summer offerings and cannot speak of Capitol Campus' future summer plans. She said "Each unit is self-contained and it will be up to the local campus

to figure what its needs are." Tischler will work with deans, department heads, faculty members and students to develop innovative and attractive summer programs that will capitalize on Penn State's strength.

Studies will be made to ascertain what the market is. "Right now," according to Tischler, "out of 10,000 students that come to summer session, 40 per-

cent are graduate students and a large percentage of those are in education. We need to know what those graduate students want as well as the undergraduate."

"There will be courses that are one, two, and three weeks long," continued Tischler. She said, "We can draw on some of the non-traditional students, alumni and teenagers. We don't have to do everything for credit. We can find out which people would come to Penn State if we offered courses

for them and what courses would be appropriate to offer."

"Traditionally University Park does a lot of theatre in summer and offers mostly liberal arts and sciences. There is not as much, as a rule, in engineering or business," reflected Tischler.

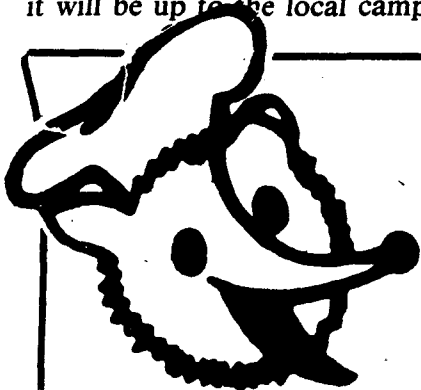
That is a typical picture at Capitol Campus during the summer also. "Here," said Tischler, "students have on occasion gotten together in a theatre company. In the past there have been courses in children's theatre and nineteenth century theatre."

Tischler who teaches courses in World Theatre and Southern Literature is a well-known authority on Tennessee Williams and authored the book *Tennessee Williams: Rebellious Puritan*. It looks like the plays of Williams and Lillian Hellman will be remaining on the shelf until Dr. Tischler resumes teaching at Capitol Campus next year. "Williams' summer sessions may

be all done," but Penn State's are alive and well at University Park with Tischler coordinating them.

Tischler joined the faculty in 1966. Before that, she served on the faculty at George Washington University, Washington, D.C., and at Susquehanna University, Selinsgrove, PA. At Capitol Campus her many responsibilities have included: chairperson of Humanities graduate and undergraduate programs, chairperson of Penn State's Faculty Senate in 1981-82, member of Faculty Advisory Committee to the President and member of the University's Commission for Women.

Tischler earned a baccalaureate degree at Wilson's Teacher College and her master of arts and doctor of philosophy degrees in English at the University of Arkansas. She is a member of Kappa Delta Pi and Phi Beta Kappa and was a Fulbright Scholar.

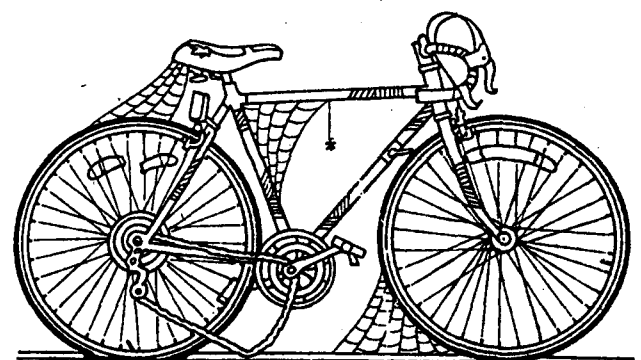
