## New incentive program makes debut in dorms this year

The DRIP program has kept the amount of damages to Capitol's dormitories at low tide.

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The Damage Reduction Incentive Plan (DRIP) will reward a floor in the dorms for keeping the amount of damages low.

DRIP was instituted by the Residence Living Program early in the Fall to provide an incentive for the floors in Church and Wrisberg Halls to keep their malicious vandalism at a minimum. In the past Resident Assistants were urged to tell their

floor members not to vandalize or the whole floor would have to split the damage bills at the year's end.

"With the DRIP program, floors now have a positive reinforcement to keep their damages down," said Pat Murphy, Coordinator of the Reidence Living Program.
