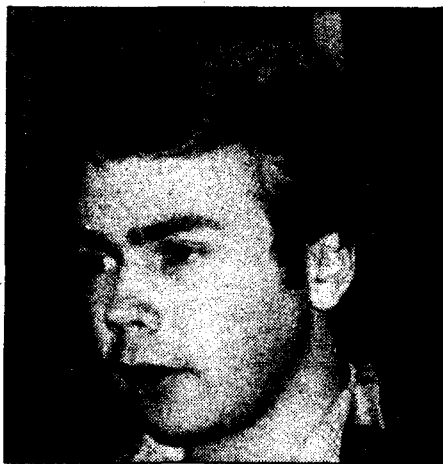


"No. It's not necessary. There's no crime on this campus. The campus is too small to need them."

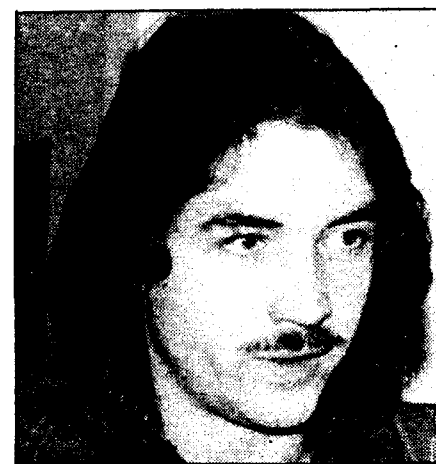
"Yes, to protect themselves. I'm not suggesting guns, but whatever is necessary -- maybe stricter rules."
