Eighteen schools attend Model U.N.

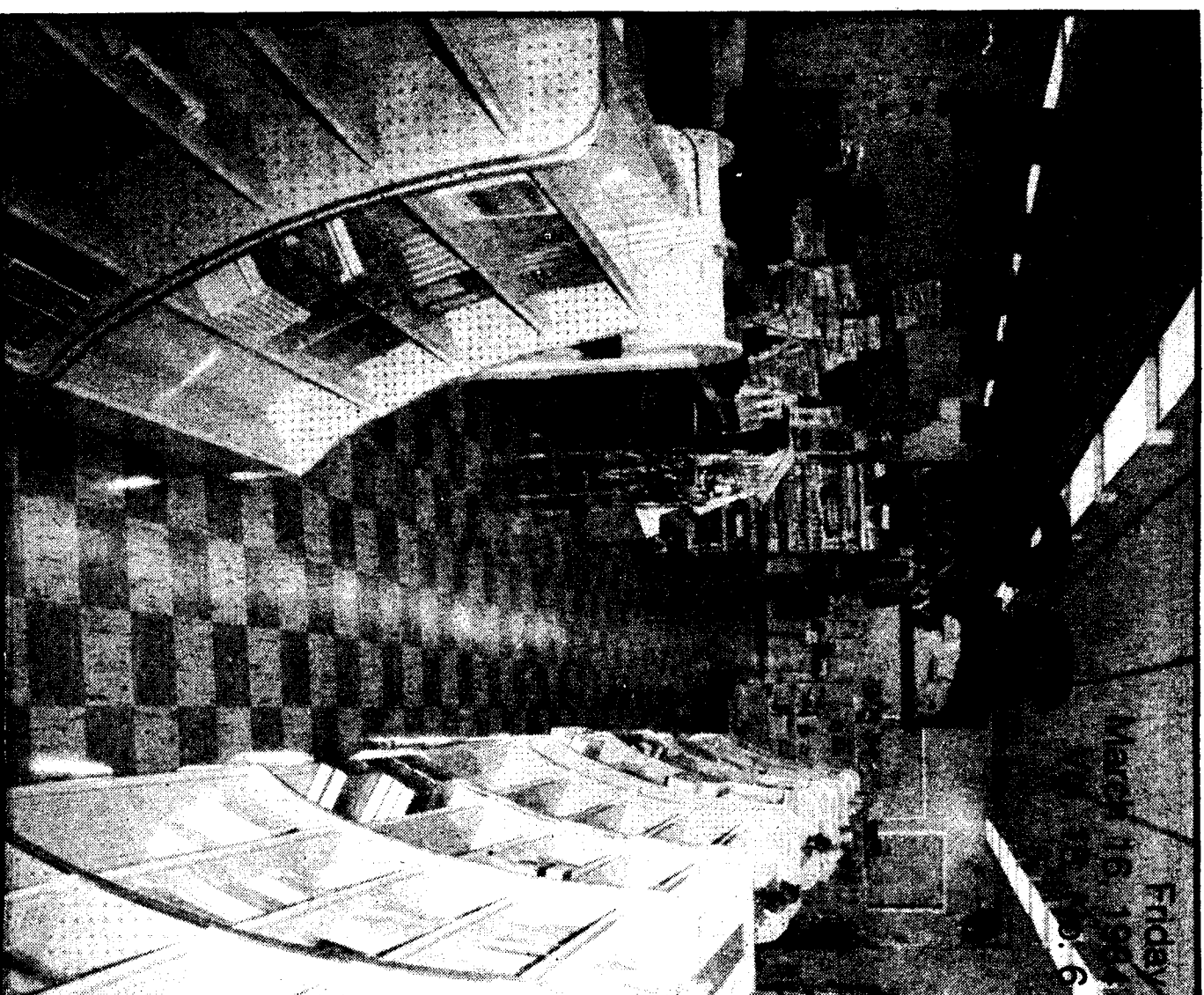
