Yucelt Studies Generic Products

Dr. Uger Yucelt, associate professor of marketing, has written a paper entitled, "Consumer Perceptions of Generic Grocery Products: Users vs. Non-Users," which has been accepted for publication in "Marketing Intelligence and Planning."

Yucelt said that he did a study to understand purchasing of generic products. The study showed generic products are 40 percent less than national brands in price and 20 percent less in price than store brands. These differences are due to simple packaging, producing and advertising. The savings are passed on to the consumer.

Generic products were first introduced in France. They were introduced in the United States in 1977 by the Jewel-T chain of Chicago.

The actual manu-

facturers are virtually anonymous. Also, the quality of materials used cannot be revealed. Yucelt found that some generic products were excellent quality while others appeared to just meet minimal Food and Drug Administra-tion standards.

More women than men use generic prod-

ucts. Women are usually more concerned

with price while men care more about availability of a certain product.

Generic products often come in only one size. This sometimes tends to be a deterrent to the use of the prod- ucts by both men and women. Also, coupons usually cannot be used for generic products, so coupons tend to encourage the use of brand name products. Finally, since the identity of the manufacturer of a generic product is usually not known, the consumer does not have anyone to write to about problems with the product.
