At the same time, we born-againers have to get our public relations act together. When a movie like this comes along, we should study it in great detail.

The stereotype of the knee-jerk reactionary is not going to disappear unless we start to think about the modern world, realizing that we can't continue simply poo-pooing everything the modern world does.

Instead, we have to take up our pens, our brushes and our film cameras, and creatively engage the secularists where they are. And I bid folks from other religious persuasions to do the same. Only when we're *all* able to articulate our various perspectives, will truth float to the top.

And, oh yes--I was trying to figure out what the movie is trying to do. I guess we'll have to read the book.
