

Art Review Lancaster-Harrisburg exhibit

Penn State art teacher Linda Mylin Ross organized the first united exhibit between the Lancaster and Harrisburg art communities. Both exhibits are now on display in the Gallery Lounge.

The Harrisbug exhibit features 19 oil and acrylic paintings. The Lancaster group exibits a variety of mediums including oil ,acrylic, watercolor, ink, crayon and pastel.

"Hopefully this will be the first of many," Ross said.

As an artist, Ross has exhibited in the Lancaster and the Harrisbug area. She views the exhibit as the first step in bringing together members of the two organizations to exchange ideas.

The gallery exhibit does not represent all the works of the two organizations, but Ross pointed out that many locally acclaimed artists are shown.

Half of the exhibit consists of awardwinning works from Lancaster's recent membership show. The other half, consist of paintings from Harrisburg's Expressive Art Assembly, a group made up of members of Charles Hidely's painting class.

Ross said the Lancaster exhibit showed an interest in the traditional genres of painting, such as still-lifes of figures and things, traditional landscape, as well as craftmanship in design.

The personality of Lancaster County is reflected in the photo-realism of a young boy in a who is eating a watermelon, or the painting simply titled Hard Pretzels-looks as if you could rub the salt off the pretzel with your thumb.

However, not all the works are traditional in nature. Some are silhouettes of huge masses of structure two others are designs, or cartoon-like.
