and Bud is a 2-point favorite over Bud Light. The Bud Light team is thirsty for a victory after last years loss and Bud

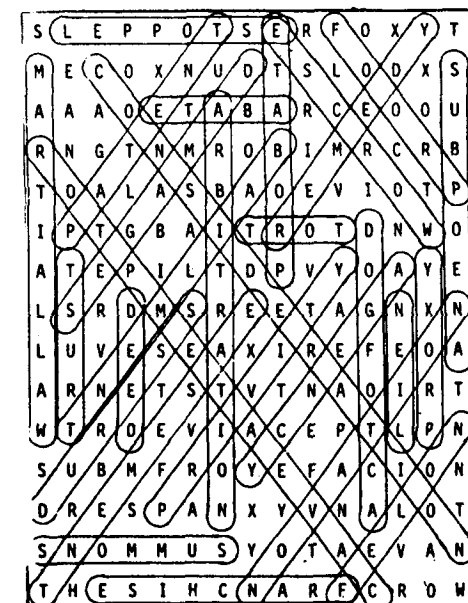
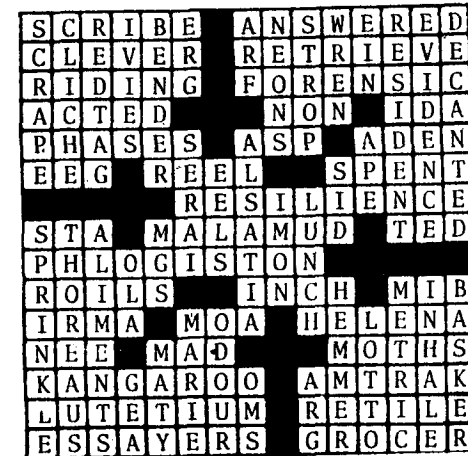
better watch out. I smell an upset brewing...
